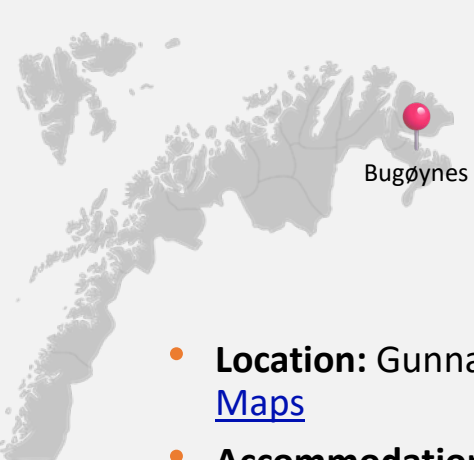
Explore the rugged moraine on foot, challenge yourself with glacier hikes using crampons, or paddle alongside the glacier front to observe the abundant wildlife.

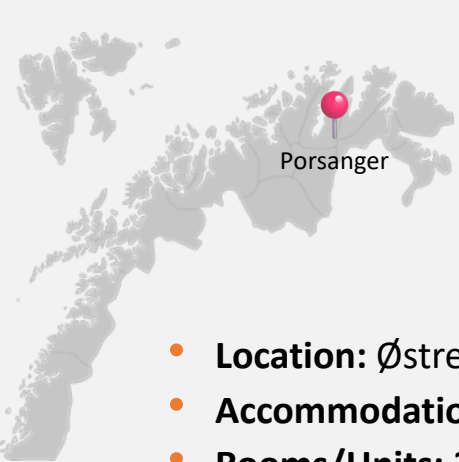

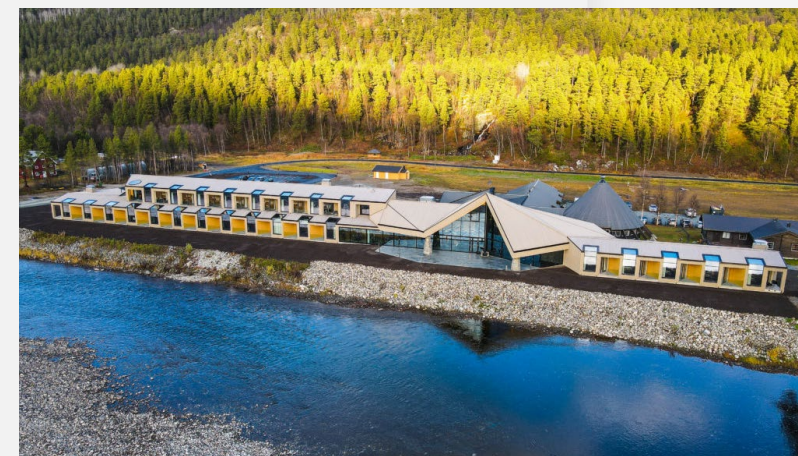

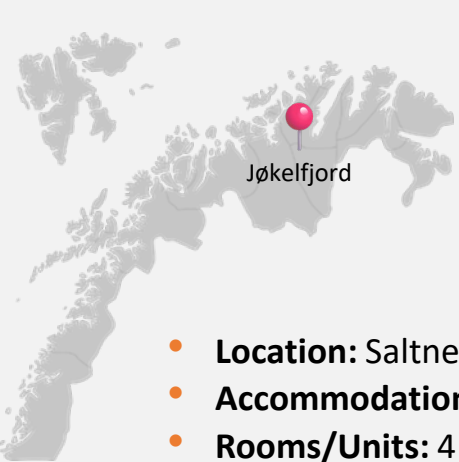

Isbreen The Glacier is a remote, design-led glamping experience tucked between towering peaks and the sea in Jøkelfjord, a tiny village at the edge of the Arctic, just over an hour from Alta. Here, where Norway's only glacier that calves directly into the sea meets pure stillness, nature takes centre stage.

A small cluster of insulated, year-round domes offers comfort without compromise. Inside: soft bedding, thoughtful design, and fjord-facing windows that frame the northern lights or midnight sun. Outside: silence, wild weather, and an untouched landscape that invites deep presence.

Guests gather for seasonal, home-cooked meals in the shared Arctic kitchen, unwind in the wood-fired sauna, or venture out on glacier hikes, fjord kayaking, or slow walks along the shore. Every experience is personal, rooted in the rhythm of the landscape and hosted with warmth.

Isbreen The Glacier is not just a place to stay. it's a place to disconnect, breathe deeper, and feel the raw beauty of the Arctic coast.

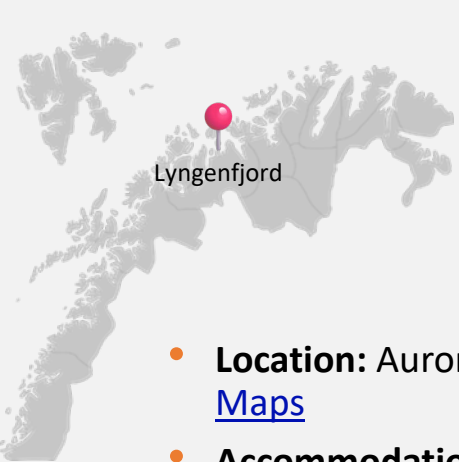
At the end of the 15th century, the first Sami people arrived here for summer pasture. Today, you can still see the stone-built fences once used to guide reindeer down from the mountains.

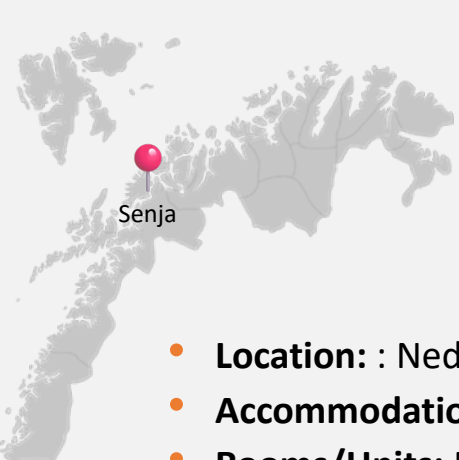
Torsken Brygge was originally built in 1930 by Olai Andreassen after the original wharf was destroyed by fire. Though initially intended as a flour warehouse, it was repurposed for fishing and storage. Boasting the deepest quay in Torsken, it could accommodate the largest boats.

The building originally housed two “fisherman’s rooms” with four beds, a sink, and an oven—today’s hotel rooms 101 and 102—retaining their original size but updated with modern bathrooms. Its distinctive mansard roof adds to the building’s character.

The quay was removed in the 1960s, and the structure fell into disrepair until Wilsgård purchased it and began renovations in 2020. Today, Torsken Brygge operates as a boutique hotel featuring seven double rooms, a pub, and a shared lounge.
